Course Description:

This presentation will discuss definitions, risk factors and dynamics of child labor and sex trafficking, before examining the role of the health professional in recognizing child trafficking and contributing to a holistic, multidisciplinary response that is trauma-informed and culturally responsive. We'll discuss ways health and other child-serving professionals and their organizations can optimize patient/client care through the use of protocols and core competencies.

She is the medical director of the International Centre for Missing and Exploited Children and she founded the Institute on Healthcare and Human Trafficking at the Stephanie Blank Center for Safe and Healthy Children at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. She also served as the medical director of the Blank Center. She was a co-chair of the Education/Training committee for HEAL Trafficking, an organization of medical professionals working on human trafficking issues. She is a board member of the International Society on the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (ISPCAN).
