Course Description:

This training will discuss strategies for organizing forensic interviews with young children, specifically when multiple forms of maltreatment or multiple incidents are disclosed within the same interview. It will also cover linguistic strategies for interviewing young children.

Learning Objectives:

1. Understand how narrative event practice narrative, mirroring the child's language and interview aids can be utilized to parse out individual accounts of multiple events or instances of abuse and maltreatment.
2. Learn tools and strategies for making the forensic interview and communication more accessible and effective for young children.
3. Explore sample language useful for interviews with young children.
